Your streaming account is expiring! Your service will end immediately unless you provide a new credit card number.


It Might Be a Scammer if They:

- Pretend to be a person or company you know.
- 2 Say there is a problem or a prize.
- 3 Pressure you to act immediately.
- 4 Tell you to pay, often in a specific way.



Questions To Help Identify Scams

- WHO is really sending me this message?
- WHAT do they want me to do?
- WHY are they asking me to do it?



Useful Responses to Scams



Pause



Read the message out loud



Keep personal information private



Delete questionable messages



Get help from a parent or trusted adult to contact the real company



Don't click on any links

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


Secure the Grounds
