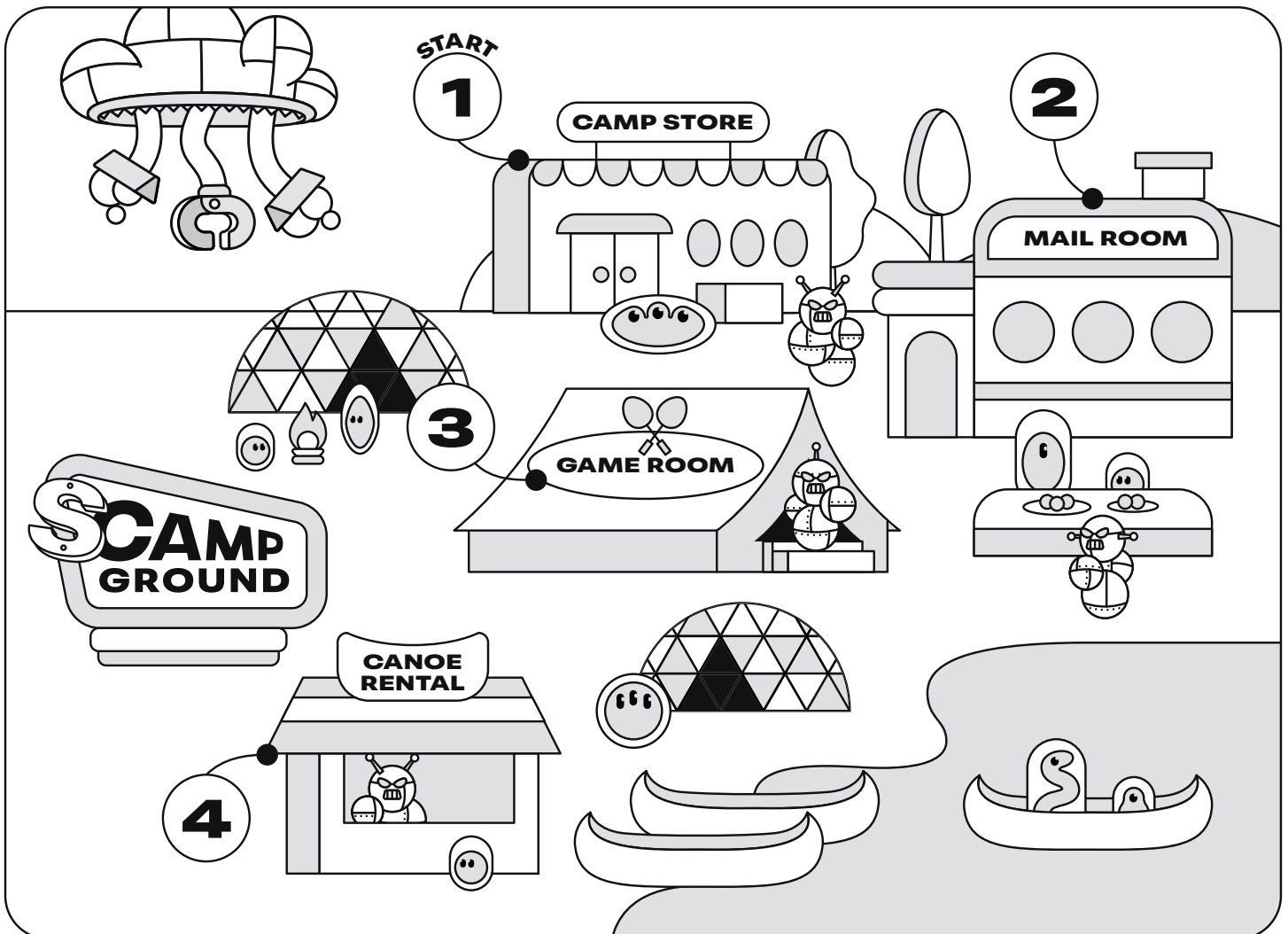


Secure the Grounds
