


How would you respond in a situation where someone starts making negative and hurtful comments online?

Bystanders and Upstanders

- People who witness bullying usually fall into one of two groups:
 - » A bystander is someone who witnesses bullying.
 - » An upstander is someone who recognizes when something is wrong and takes action to help make it right.
- Have you ever been an upstander or bystander?




Spread Positivity

Get a parent or trusted adult to help practice answering questions like:


WHAT kind of online communication is and isn't okay?

WHEN should I remain a bystander?



Options for Upstander Responses



Don't create or spread harmful or untrue messages online



Don't encourage the bully



Stand up for the person being bullied



Support the person who is being bullied in person or online



Block or report the bully



Talk to a parent or trusted adult




With your group, think about steps an upstander would take in each situation. Use the options below or write your own responses.

The Journey of an Upstander


Create a Digital Citizenship **Comic Strip**
