Answers may vary.



You get a text message offering a free tablet if you give them your date of birth and home address.

Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? I don't know who wants this information. It could be a scammer.
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to give my date of birth and home address.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? I don't know why they want my personal information, so I won't share it.

Answer: I will not share any information and I will delete the text message.



A pop-up on your tablet says there's a problem with your software. You're asked to enter a credit card number to pay \$29.99 or your tablet will be shut down.

Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? *I don't know who wants this information.* Could be a scammer.
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to give a credit card number and pay money.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? They want a credit card number to fix a software problem, but I don't know if I really have a software problem.

Answer: I will not share any credit card number, and I'll talk to a trusted adult or parent.



Someone with an online profile that looks like your best friend is asking questions your friend wouldn't ask. Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? I'm not sure who wants this information. The profile looks like my best friend, but it doesn't sound like them.
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want information from me.*

 WHY do they want my personal information? I don't know why they want my information. Maybe they're trying to get into my email account.
Answer: I will not answer any questions from my friend. I will ignore the message and talk to my friend in person to see what's going on.



An ad in a game says you'll get free coins if you enter an email address.

Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? A company that placed the ad in a game.
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to give them my email address.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? I don't know why they want my email address. Maybe they want to send me emails, and try to get me to buy stuff.

Answer: I will not share my email address because I don't know why they need it.



An online game you're thinking about playing asks for your date of birth.

Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? An online game wants this information.
- **WHAT** are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to give them my date of birth.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? *I don't know why they need this information. Maybe there's an age restriction on the game.*

Answer: I will not share any information, and I will talk to a parent or trusted adult first.



Someone you met playing a video game asks, "Where do you live?" Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? Someone I met playing a video game.
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want to know where I live.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? I don't know why they need

this information. Maybe they want to become friends with me? Or maybe it's a scammer? Answer: I will not share my information. I will talk to a parent or trusted adult first.



A game you're playing on your parent's phone asks for their email address and full date of birth — month/day/year. Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? *The game wants the information.*
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to give the full date of birth of my parents.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? *I don't know why they need this information. Maybe there's an age restriction on the game.*

Answer: I will not share any information. I will talk to my parents or a trusted adult first.



You get a text message that you didn't expect. It looks like it's from an online store.

Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? *The online store or a scammer wants the information.*
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to enter my address and payment information.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? Maybe they need my address and payment information because they need to be updated. Or maybe it's a scammer because I didn't order anything from this store recently.

Answer: I will not respond to the text message or click on any links. I will talk to my parents or a trusted adult and log on to the online store account to see details.



You get a text message that says you can get a free tablet just for filling out a survey. The survey asks for your name, address, date of

birth, and Social Security number.

Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? I don't know who wants this information.
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to take a survey and give my name, address, date of birth, and Social Security number.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? *I don't know why they want my personal information.*

Answer: I will not give my personal information, because I don't know why they need it.



You get a text message from someone you don't know saying, "Your sibling is hurt. Quick! What's your parent's phone number?" Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? I don't know who wants this information. It could be a scammer or it could be someone who is with my sibling.
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want my parent's phone number.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? Maybe they want my parent's phone number so they can trick them into getting money. Or maybe my sibling is really hurt and they need to call them.

Answer: I will not share any information on the text message. I will talk to my parents first and then call my sibling directly.



You're at the doctor's office and the receptionist asks for your date of birth.

Discussion and answer:

- WHO wants this information? *The receptionist wants my information.*
- WHAT are they trying to get me to do? *They want me to give my date of birth.*
- WHY do they want my personal information? Maybe the receptionist is trying to verify my identity and look me up in their computer system.

Answer: I would have my parent or a trusted adult give my date of birth to the receptionist.
